

CONDITIONAL I: **would + infinitive**

Look at the sentences. When do we use *CONDITIONAL I*?

I **would like** to live abroad.

Would you **like** some coffee or tea?

I **would buy** a condominium or a detached house if I **had** a lot of money.

I **wouldn't do** that if I **were** you.

We use *CONDITIONAL I*

⇒ if we want to express something in a friendly way

⇒ if we ask polite questions

⇒ in if - clauses (type 2)

CONDITIONAL II: **would + have + past participle**

Look at the sentences. When do we use *CONDITIONAL II*?

If you **had sung** at the party, we **would have come**.

She **would have stayed** in the USA if she **hadn't got** all her family in Europe.

She **would have married** him if he **had asked** her to become his wife.

We use *CONDITIONAL II* in if - clauses (type 3).
