POSITIVE SENTENCES	
I have a clever dog.	I have got a clever dog.
You have a smart sister.	You have got a smart sister.
He has a younger brother.	He has got a younger brother.
She has brothers and sisters.	She has got brothers and sisters.
We have a big house.	We have got a big house.
You have clean shoes.	You have got clean shoes.
They have many pets.	They have got many pets.

NEGATIVE SENTENCES	
I don't have a clever cat.	I haven't got a clever cat.
You don't have a smart brother.	You haven't got a smart brother.
He doesn't have a younger sister.	He hasn't got a younger sister.
She doesn't have any pets.	She hasn't got any pets.
We don't have a big garden.	We haven't got a big garden.
You don't have dirty shoes.	You haven't got dirty shoes.
They don't have any children.	They haven't got any children.

ASKING QUESTIONS

POSITIVE SENTENCE	QUESTION	NEGATION
She has a house. She has got a house.	Does she have a house? Has she got a house?	No, she does not have a house. No, she hasn't got a house:
They have a car. They have got a car.	Do they have a car? Have they got a car?	No, they don't have a car. No, they haven't got a car.
