

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS

1. Usage

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS verwendet man, wenn von einer Handlung die Rede ist, die in der Vergangenheit begonnen hat und **noch andauert!**

2. Statements (Aussagesätze)

I **have been** studying for several hours.

You **have been** dancing for a long time (now).

He **has been** playing soccer for several years.

She **has been** going to this school since 1999.

They **have been** travelling around the world for six weeks

3. Negation (Verneinung)

I **haven't (= have not) been** studying for several hours.

You **haven't been** dancing for a long time (now).

He **hasn't (= has not) been** playing soccer for several years.

She **hasn't been** going to this school since 1999.

They **haven't been** travelling around the world for six weeks

4. Asking question

Have you really **been** studying for several hours?

Has he **been** playing soccer for several years?

5. Negation in questions

Haven't you already been to New York?

Have you **not** already been to New York?
